January 23 — Ed O'Malley
President & CEO of the Kansas Leadership Center

Topic: *Striving to be a Center of Excellence for Leadership Development*

The titles "president" and "CEO" may conjure up traditional notions of authoritarian leadership, but Ed O'Malley, who holds those titles at the Kansas Leadership Center, doesn't see them that way. O'Malley spent four years as a state legislator, with a ringside seat for both effective and ineffective displays of civic leadership. To him, leadership is not a title, personality trait or workshop topic. Instead, it's an opportunity that people can grasp and choose to exercise in many different ways and venues. As president and CEO of the Kansas Leadership

Center located in Wichita, O'Malley leads a first-of-its-kind training center charged with fostering largescale civic leadership for healthier communities.

O'Malley holds a bachelor's degree in history from Kanas State University and has completed leadership courses at Harvard Business School and Harvard University John F. Kennedy School of Government. He is the co-author of the book *For the Common Good: Redefining Civic Leadership* published in 2013.



January 30 — Bill Voloch
President and Chief Operating Officer
Wesley Medical Center

Topic: *Wesley Healthcare: Present and Future*

Bill Voloch joined Wesley Healthcare as chief operating officer in 2013 and was promoted to president and CEO in 2015. Wesley Healthcare comprises the 859-bed Wesley Medical Center, the 82-bed Wesley Woodlawn Hospital & Emergency Room (ER) and the Wesley EmergencyCare Network of four emergency departments, including two free-standing ERs. The Wesley Derby ER opened in November 2016. This free-standing emergency room has 11 beds, imaging capabilities and an on-site laboratory.

Wesley services all of Kansas as a regional referral center for high-risk pregnancies, surgeries, critical care and trauma. Wesley Medical Center is a certified level I trauma center, a level II pediatric trauma center and has one of the largest women's programs in HCA with approximately 6,200 deliveries in 2016.

Voloch was instrumental in the planning and development of the \$28 million Wesley Children's Hospital, which opened in 2016. Under his leadership, Wesley Healthcare has experienced the highest employee, physician and patient satisfaction scores in the history of Wesley.

Prior to joining Wesley Healthcare, he served as chief financial officer for The Medical Center of Aurora. He earned a master's degree in business administration from Regis University in Denver. Bill lives in Wichita with his wife, Juli, and their five children.
