Topic: Wesley Healthcare: Present and Future

Bill Voloch joined Wesley Healthcare as chief operating officer in 2013 and was promoted to president and CEO in 2015. Wesley Healthcare comprises the 859-bed Wesley Medical Center, the 82-bed Wesley Woodlawn Hospital & ER and the Wesley EmergencyCare Network of four emergency departments, including two free-standing emergency rooms. The Wesley Derby ER opened in November 2016. This free-standing emergency room has 11 beds, imaging capabilities and an on-site laboratory.

Wesley services all of Kansas as a regional referral center for high-risk pregnancies, surgeries, critical care and trauma. Wesley Medical Center is a certified level I trauma center, a level II pediatric trauma center and has one of the largest women's programs in HCA with approximately 6,200 deliveries in 2016. Voloch was instrumental in the planning and development of the \$28 million Wesley Children's Hospital which opened in 2016. Under his leadership, Wesley Healthcare has experienced the highest employee, physician and patient satisfaction scores in the history of Wesley.

Prior to joining Wesley Healthcare, Voloch served as chief financial officer for The Medical Center of Aurora. He earned a master's degree in business administration from Regis University in Denver. He lives in Wichita with his wife, Juli, and their five children.

Daniel Hege, Music Director and Conductor of the Wichita Symphony Orchestra
Wayne Bryan, Producing Artistic Director of Wichita Music Theatre
Topic: Carousel in Concert - A Musical Collaboration

Daniel Hege and Wayne Bryan will share some of the background of the show *Carousel* and its music and will offer insight into the unique presentation that is being created for Wichita audiences.

For its first ever full-scale collaboration, Wichita Symphony Orchestra, led by Maestro Daniel Hege, and Music Theatre Wichita, led by producing artistic director Wayne Bryan, are presenting Rodgers and Hammerstein's classic *Carousel* in a semi-staged production at Century II Concert Hall, February 11 and 12. The cast stars Broadway veteran Matt Bogart as Billy Bigelow, with other leading roles played by Kerry Conte, Katie Banks-Todd, Hannah Fernandes, Matt Udland and Steve Hitchcock. The Act II ballet will be performed by two New Yorkers with Wichita connections, Whitney Cooper and Nicholas Palmquist who also choreographs. The cast will also feature a 40-member ensemble from Butler County Community College, under the direction of Matt Udland, with musical staging by Joshua Larson.

Carousel was Richard Rodgers' own favorite score, with the original 1945 production running almost 900 performances, and then becoming a successful film for 20th Century Fox. Songs include *June Is Bustin' Out All Over*, *If I Loved You*, *You'll Never Walk Alone* and *The Carousel Waltz*.



The 2016-2017 season marks Daniel Hege's seventh as music director and conductor of the Wichita Symphony Orchestra. Hege is the seventh music director in the Orchestra's 73-year history. He has been widely recognized as one of America's finest conductors, earning critical acclaim for his fresh interpretations of the standard repertoire and for his commitment to creative programming.



Wayne Bryan is beginning his 30th season as producing artistic director for Music Theatre Wichita. In the course of his tenure here, Music Theatre has grown from a theatre with a budget of \$800,000 a year to the most highly subscribed non-profit arts organization in Kansas, with a budget of over \$4 million.
