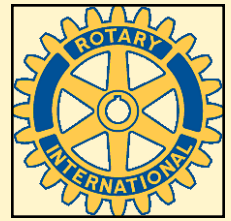

Topic: *Elephants Can Fly — Swaziland to Wichita by 747*

Mark Reed joined the Sedgwick County Zoo as assistant director in 1979 under R. L. Blakely, the zoo's original director. In 1991, he was named executive director and served in that capacity until his retirement in 2016. Prior to joining our zoo, Reed gained seven years of animal curatorial experience with the San Antonio Zoological Gardens & Aquarium, where he was responsible for overseeing all areas of operations and future development.

Although he did not grow up in Kansas, Reed spent summers at both grandparents' farms, where he developed farming skills, including driving a pickup, bailing hay and working in the fields. He continued the tradition and became the third generation of his family to graduate from Kansas State University. In addition, he earned a master's degree in park administration from Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas.

Reed has served as president of the Association of Zoos & Aquariums (AZA) and is a member of the World Association of Zoos & Aquariums (WAZA).

Mark was active in the Rotary Club of Wichita and has hosted our club to zoo outings over the years. Mark and his wife, Mary, are in the process of relocating to the northwest United States and finding their next big adventure.

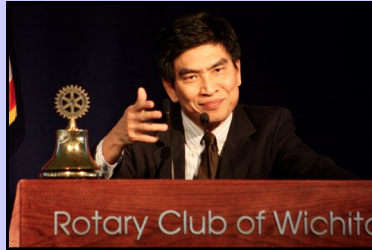

ZIMBABWE CLEAN WATER PROJECT

The Rotary Club of Andover reports the clean water project in Zimbabwe is complete! Several local area Rotary clubs, including the Rotary Club of Wichita, donated funds to make this possible. A permanent water supply was installed to service a new school in rural Zimbabwe where no clean water was available. A filtration and treatment system was also installed along with 500 meters of piping and a new large water storage tank that gravity feeds the faucet at the school. This project benefited 170 students and local community members. Utilization of as many assets as possible helped keep the costs as low as possible.
