

**March 13 — Roy Heatherly, *The Wichita Eagle* President and Publisher**  
**Steve Coffman, *The Wichita Eagle* Executive Editor and Vice President of News**

**Topic: *Changes in the Industry and at The Wichita Eagle and What it Means for Business and Our Community***



Roy Heatherly came to *The Wichita Eagle* in June, 2015, to assume the role of president and publisher from the *The Jackson Sun* in Tennessee, where he was president, publisher and advertising director. Heatherly was born in St. Louis and moved to Wichita in the fifth grade. After graduating from the University of Kansas with a bachelor's degree in journalism, he went to work in radio sales in Chanute, KS. In 1980, he joined the *Sun* as a retail sales representative and later served as director of advertising. Ten years later, he joined the *News Star* in Monroe, LA as director of advertising. In 2008, he returned to the *Sun* as publisher. Roy and his wife, Beth, have three adult children.



Steve Coffman is the executive editor/vice president of news at *The Wichita Eagle/Kansas.com*, a position he has held since Aug. 1, 2016. He previously worked as the executive editor/director of content and audience development at *The Jackson Sun* in Jackson, Tennessee. Earlier, he served as the regional editor and later metro editor of *The Fayetteville Observer* in North Carolina and as a reporter and news editor at *The Finger Lakes Times* in Geneva, New York.

Coffman has been recognized with numerous awards for reporting, headline writing and editorial writing. He is a graduate of Lock Haven University of Pennsylvania with a degree in journalism and has worked for 30 years in the news business. His wife, Jean, is a teacher. Their son, Luke, is a junior in high school and their older son, Ben, is a junior at the University of Alabama in Huntsville.

**Singer, Songwriter and Bartlett Arboretum Owner**

**Topic: *Reflections and Songs from the Garden***

Robin Macy sings from her heart with original compositions inspired by tending the Kansas heartland.

Macy, with guitar-slinger husband, Kentucky White, plays roots music that harkens to an earlier time, influenced by their ongoing work at historic Bartlett Arboretum, the century-old bountiful patch of nature now listed on the National Registry of Historic Places. She stumbled into this unlikely wonderland when she took a wrong turn and has been devoted to its ongoing renaissance ever since. For over thirty years, Macy has traveled America's byways performing music with various groups – some more famous than others. After a devoted teaching career, she now pays homage to the Good Earth through song and as steward of her volunteer army of Soil Sisters and Brothers. Her three solo releases, beginning with the 2008 *Songs from the Garden*, are anthems which celebrate the agrarian life and lessons learned from loving and living on the land.
