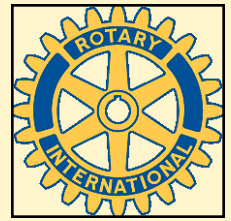

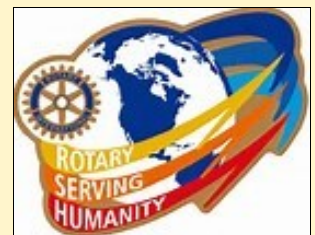

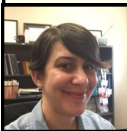

Topic: *Earthquakes in Kansas*

On September 3, 2016, Wichita was awakened by a 5.7 earthquake which originated in Pawnee, OK. This was the largest earthquake ever recorded in Oklahoma or Wichita and was the culmination of a series of increasingly large earthquakes in northern Oklahoma. Tandis Bidgoli, an assistant scientist for the Kansas Geologic Survey, and Steve Hausman, an insurance agent who handles earthquake insurance in Wichita, will help us understand the cause of these quakes, the kind of damage we might expect and what measures we can take to protect our families and our property.



Tandis Bidgoli holds a Ph.D. in geology from the University of Kansas where she serves as an assistant scientist. Prior to this position, she held the position of exploration geologist at ExxonMobil where she worked on a variety of technical projects focused on the oil and gas fields and basins in the United States, Germany and South America.



Steve Hausmann earned a business management degree from Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. He worked in the golf industry as a PGA professional and has been a member of the PGA for 23 years. For 16 years, he served as the head golf professional at Algonquin Golf Club in St. Louis, MO. After Steve and his wife moved to Wichita, he purchased his State Farm agency in 2014.

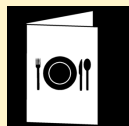

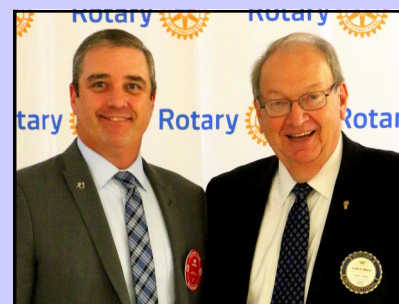

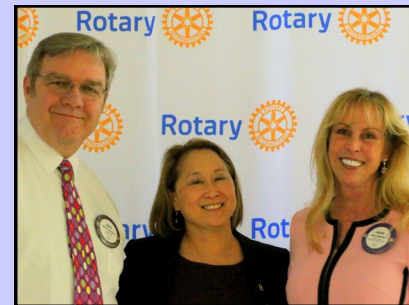
ROTARY MEETING NOTES — APRIL 10
