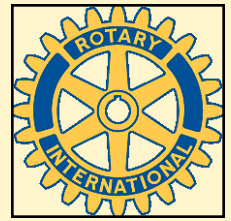

May 1 — Mark Potter — Former Men's Basketball Coach Newman University

Topic: A Heart to Serve — Winning at the Game of Life



Mark Potter was a head men's basketball coach for 30 years. He recently left the coaching profession to pursue his passion for educating and motivating people from all occupations. Today he speaks on many topics including motivation and mental toughness, but his greatest passion lies in his personal battle with severe depression. Twelve years ago, Potter knew something wasn't right and he began a downward spiral into a world of darkness. He missed eight games and

25 practices due to severe depression. Since that time, he has been on a crusade to educate people about depression and encourage others suffering from mental illness to seek assistance. His passion is to share his story in hopes that people will pursue treatment and find a way to live productively with mental illness.

Potter coached over 800 games during his 30-year tenure. He has the most victories and highest winning percentage in Newman University's program history. His teams have been successful at all levels. He had four state tournament appearances during his high school coaching career and four national tournament appearances in his college coaching career. Potter has been named top 15 most influential people in the Wichita sports world and was recently inducted into the Wichita Sports Hall of Fame.

Mark and his wife, Nanette, have been married over 30 years and have two grown children, Zechariah and Chelsey, and one granddaughter named Sterling.

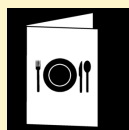
