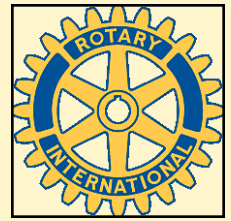

**August 7 — Ronn McMahon, President and CEO
Greater Wichita Area YMCA**

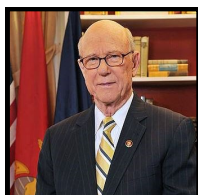
Topic: *IMAGINE! A Better Us — Strengthening the Community for ALL!*

On August 7, we will hear an update from Ronn McMahan on the Greater Wichita YMCA, including its impact on the community, new programs designed and implemented to fill in family and societal gaps and new partnerships forged with Wichita State University and the Wichita Police department.

McMahon stepped into the role of president and CEO on January 1, 2016, succeeding Dennis Schoenebeck, who retired after 25 years of service. The Greater Wichita Area YMCA is one of the top performing YMCA's in the county and serves almost 300,000 children and adults every year. He began his career as a program director with the YMCA in Tacoma Washington in 1997, where he assumed multiple leadership roles as the organization grew from 30,000 members to over 120,000 members.

McMahon was drawn to sports at an early age. At 5'9", he played basketball at Eastern Washington University (EWU) where he led the NCAA Division I in steals and is still ranked fifth in all time steals per game. He will be inducted into the EWU Hall of Fame this September. After college, he played basketball professionally with stints in Europe, Mexico and Asia. He is a dual U.S. and Canadian citizen and had the opportunity to play several years for the Canadian National Team. He played in the 1992 Tournament of the Americas against the original U.S. "Dream Team" made up of Michael Jordan, Magic Johnson, Larry Bird and other superstars.

McMahon's competitive nature, drive for constant improvement and dedication to servant leadership serves him well in his role as president and CEO. He is passionate about the organization's mission to reach out to the entire community in the areas of youth development, healthy living and social responsibility. He is married to Lisa and they have two children.



August 14 — United States Senator Pat Roberts

Topic: *Washington Update*

Senator Pat Roberts was born in Topeka, graduated from Holton High School and went on to earn his journalism degree from Kansas State University. For 16 years, he represented the Big First District, which included his home of Dodge City, in the U.S. House of Representatives. In 1996, Roberts was elected to the U.S. Senate, where he is currently serving his fourth term.

Roberts is chairman of the Senate Agriculture committee and is a senior member of the Senate Finance committee. In addition, he is a member of the Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) committee and co-chairman of the Senate Rural Health caucus.

Roberts served as chairman of the Senate Intelligence committee for four years and is proud to serve as chairman of the Eisenhower Memorial Commission, working to complete a national memorial to honor President Dwight D. Eisenhower. He is also privileged to be a member of the Senate Rules committee and the Senate Ethics committee.

Following graduation from Kansas State University in 1958, Roberts served in the U.S. Marine Corps for four years, then worked as a reporter and editor for several Arizona newspapers. He joined the staff of Kansas' U.S. Senator Frank Carlson in 1967. In 1969, he became administrative assistant to First District U.S. Congressman Keith Sebelius. He and his wife, Franki, have three grown children and six grandchildren.
