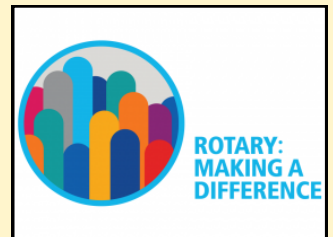

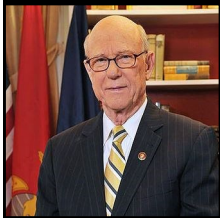

August 14 — United States Senator Pat Roberts

Topic: *Washington Update*

Senator Pat Roberts was born in Topeka, graduated from Holton High School and went on to earn his journalism degree from Kansas State University. For 16 years, he represented the Big First District, which included his home of Dodge City, in the U.S. House of Representatives. In 1996, Roberts was elected to the U.S. Senate, where he is currently serving his fourth term.

Roberts is chairman of the Senate Agriculture committee and is a senior member of the Senate Finance committee. In addition, he is a member of the Health, Education, Labor and Pensions (HELP) committee and co-chairman of the Senate Rural Health caucus.

Roberts served as chairman of the Senate Intelligence committee for four years and is proud to serve as chairman of the Eisenhower Memorial Commission, working to complete a national memorial to honor President Dwight D. Eisenhower. He is also privileged to be a member of the Senate Rules committee and the Senate Ethics committee.

Following graduation from Kansas State University in 1958, Roberts served in the U.S. Marine Corps for four years, then worked as a reporter and editor for several Arizona newspapers. He joined the staff of Kansas' U.S. Senator Frank Carlson in 1967. In 1969, he became administrative assistant to First District U.S. Congressman Keith Sebelius. He and his wife, Franki, have three grown children and six grandchildren.



August 21 — Wichita Mayor Jeff Longwell

Topic: *The State of the City*

Mayor Jeff Longwell is an established resident of Wichita, growing up in a west-side neighborhood and attending West High School and Wichita State University. Longwell's private sector career has included serving as president of Ad Astra Print Resources for seven years, marketing director for The Print Source for 3 years and general manager for Thermal Trade Graphics for 11 years.

Leadership and stewardship has always been among Longwell's aspirations. He started his community involvement as a member of the Maize school board of education where his children attended school. He served 12 years where his contributions grew to leadership roles, including titles of president, vice-president, and governmental relations. These experiences led to his interest in running for City Council, where he succeeded and was appointed the District 5 City Council member in April, 2007. While serving on the council he was influential in developing more flood control, increased public safety and improved access to an emerging west Wichita.

Longwell's accomplishments on the council set the foundation for his next leadership role. On April 7, 2015, he was elected mayor to the largest city in Kansas. In addition, his political career has included a 20-year term on the Special Assessment committee and service on the WAMPO and Northwest YMCA boards. He has been a member of the Journey to Excellence strategic planning team, WSU West-Side Campus advisory board and Trans-net advisory board. He is a Sunrise Rotary Club charter member and Catholic Family Federal Credit Union board of director.

Longwell's goals and objectives are to move the City of Wichita forward by promoting economic development within city and county lines, generating jobs and creating a business-friendly environment. Jeff and his wife, Susie, have three adult children and one grandchild.

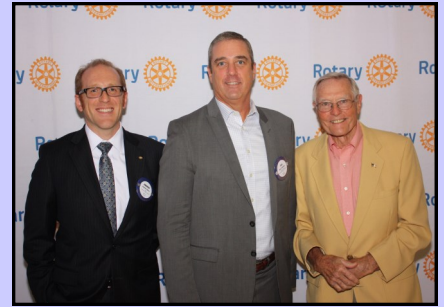
