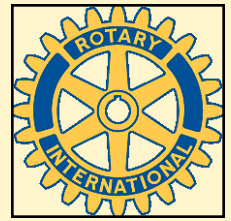

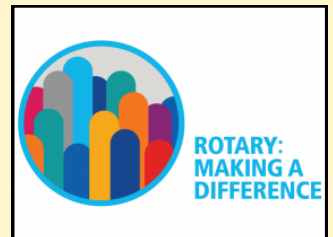

September 11 — Dr. Graham Cross
Professor of American History — Cambridge University

TOPIC: *A Special Relationship - The Friendship Between the United States and Great Britain Since WWII*

Graham Cross earned his doctorate in history from the University of Cambridge, and he specializes in twentieth century Anglo-American military, diplomatic and political history, with a focus on the era of the two world wars. He has taught American history at University College Dublin, the University of Glasgow and currently teaches at Queens' College University of Cambridge and Manchester Metropolitan University.

Dr. Cross is a respected expert on the history of the US 8th Air Force and for nearly thirty years has been the historian and UK contact for the 353rd Fighter Group. He is the author of four books covering the European air campaigns of WWII and the foreign policy of Franklin D. Roosevelt. He is currently completing a history of the US 'Friendly Invasion' of his native East Anglia during WWII.

Dr. Cross has long been interested in the way the United States has interacted with the world by military and diplomatic means throughout the twentieth century. His research has focused on the intersection of military operations, diplomacy and American politics during the first half of the twentieth century and the era of World War I & II. He is particularly interested in the military and diplomatic relationship the US has with the United Kingdom.

Topic: *NBAF: Protecting the U.S. from Natural Biothreats and Bioweapons*

In 1917, the flu pandemic infected about one-third of the world population and killed over 20 million people. In 2014, Ebola broke out in West Africa and killed about one-half of it's victims. It probably originated from contact with monkeys and other animals, but was spread among humans by contact with bodily fluids. Fortunately, by careful management in Africa and in the United States, we managed to control the disease and limit its entry into our country. Thus, the National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility (NBAF) was created to study and find ways to prevent the spread of diseases that could decimate our livestock and also possibly save our lives.

Dr. Ron Trewyn was named Kansas State University's full-time liaison to the NBAF in August 2014. Prior to that he served as K-State's vice president for research where he led the university's multi-year efforts to bring the \$1.25 billion federal research and development laboratory to Kansas. As the NBAF liaison, Trewyn works with the university president and others inside and outside the institution to facilitate and leverage NBAF-related opportunities for the university, the city and the state.

Trewyn earned a doctorate in microbial physiology from Oregon State University in 1974, with minors in biochemistry and genetics. That was after graduating from an Illinois business school in accounting, serving as a staff sergeant in the U.S. Army infantry in Vietnam and receiving a bachelor's degree in biology from the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater. Following graduate school, he conducted postdoctoral research at the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center studying the molecular biology of cancer.

From 1978 to 1994, Trewyn was a faculty member in the medical school at Ohio State University where he attained the rank of professor of medical biochemistry and directed the institution's largest interdisciplinary graduate program.

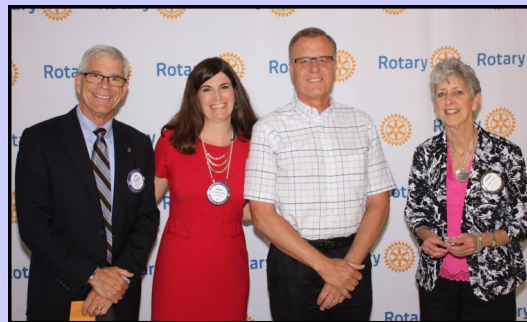
ROTARY MEETING — AUGUST 28
