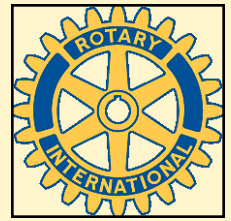

OCTOBER 23 — GREGG MARSHALL

WSU MEN'S HEAD BASKETBALL COACH

TOPIC: *NEW CONFERENCE, NEW BALLGAME!*

Gregg Marshall has built Wichita State into a monster of the Midwest and, in the process, ascended as one of college basketball's elite head coaches. Now entering his 11th season at WSU and his 20th overall, Marshall (455-173 career record) owns the nation's second-highest winning percentage since 2010-11, with an .829 success rate (208-43).

Under Marshall's guidance, WSU has been on a steady rise, topping 30 wins in four of the last five seasons (most of any team in college basketball) and 25 wins in 8 consecutive years. Marshall is one of just five Division I coaches to reach the Round of 32 in each of the last five NCAA Tournaments. His Shockers followed up a 2011 NIT Championship with six-straight NCAA Tournament bids, including trips to the 2013 Final Four and the 2015 Sweet 16. The 2014 squad ran the table in the regular season, becoming the first team in 23 years to enter the Big Dance with an unbeaten record. That historic 35-0 start also earned him consensus National Coach of the Year honors.

WSU dominated Missouri Valley Conference play, winning four-straight MVC regular season crowns with a combined 68-4 mark. No team in the 120-year history of the conference had ever won as many league games over a four-year span. In his 19 seasons as a head coach, Marshall's teams have captured 11 regular season conference titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament 13 times. He's won seven conference coach-of-the-year honors, including a run of three-in-a-row from 2012-14. Marshall (261-90 in 10 seasons at WSU) surpassed Hall of Famer Ralph Miller as the school's all-time wins leader on Feb. 3, 2016 with his 221st victory.

SUPERINTENDENT — WICHITA PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Dr. Alicia Thompson's responsibilities as superintendent of the Wichita Public Schools began formally on July 1, 2017. However, Dr. Thompson is no stranger to Wichita schools or the community. Her legacy in the Wichita district extends back to her mother, who was a veteran teacher in the Wichita district. She attended kindergarten at Carter Elementary and then transitioned to Chisholm Trail Elementary. A proud Wichita Heights Falcon, she went on to attend college at Langston University, Newman University, and ultimately received her doctorate of educational leadership from Wichita State University.

Dr. Thompson's 24-year career in Kansas' largest school district began as a teacher at Ingalls Elementary, now Spaght Magnet Elementary. She transitioned to a building leader and then a district-level administrator prior to her appointment as Wichita's superintendent this year.

Her community activities have included service on boards of directors for Goodwill Industries, American Red Cross, Real Men, Real Heroes, Leadership Wichita and Exploration Place. In her role as superintendent, she will serve the Wichita Chamber Board of Directors, Greater Wichita Partnership and Business Education Alliance. She has been honored with the Wichita Business Journal's Leadership in Diversity award, the Martin Luther King Education award from the Urban League of Kansas and the NAACP Education award.

Alicia and her husband Reggie have two daughters.
