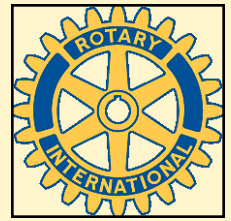

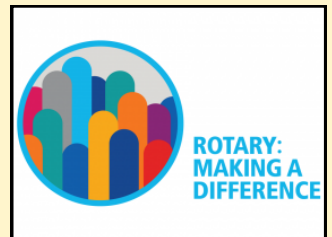

**OCTOBER 30 — DR. ALICIA THOMPSON**  
**SUPERINTENDENT — WICHITA PUBLIC SCHOOLS**  
**Topic: USD 259 UPDATE**

Dr. Alicia Thompson's responsibilities as superintendent of the Wichita Public Schools began formally on July 1, 2017. However, Dr. Thompson is no stranger to Wichita schools or the community. Her legacy in the Wichita district extends back to her mother, who was a veteran teacher in the Wichita district. She attended kindergarten at Carter Elementary and then transitioned to Chisholm Trail Elementary. A proud Wichita Heights Falcon, she went on to attend college at Langston University, Newman University, and ultimately received her doctorate of educational leadership from Wichita State University.

Dr. Thompson's 24-year career in Kansas' largest school district began as a teacher at Ingalls Elementary, now Spaght Magnet Elementary. She transitioned to a building leader and then a district-level administrator prior to her appointment as Wichita's superintendent this year.

Her community activities have included service on boards of directors for Goodwill Industries, American Red Cross, Real Men, Real Heroes, Leadership Wichita and Exploration Place. In her role as superintendent, she will serve the Wichita Chamber Board of Directors, Greater Wichita Partnership and Business Education Alliance. She has been honored with the Wichita Business Journal's Leadership in Diversity award, the Martin Luther King Education award from the Urban League of Kansas and the NAACP Education award.

Alicia and her husband Reggie have two daughters.



**NOVEMBER 6 — MIKE POMPO**  
**DIRECTOR, CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE AGENCY**  
**(Guest reservations are required by November 1)**

Mike Pompeo was sworn in as Director of the Central Intelligence Agency on January 23, 2017. As Director, he manages intelligence collection, analysis, covert action, counterintelligence, and liaison relationships with foreign intelligence services.

Before becoming Director, Mr. Pompeo was serving in his fourth term as congressman from Kansas' 4<sup>th</sup> District. He served on the House Intelligence Committee as well as on the Energy and Commerce Committees. In 2014, Mr. Pompeo was also appointed to the House Select Benghazi Committee to investigate the tragic events in Benghazi, Libya.

Prior to his service in Congress, Mr. Pompeo founded Thayer Aerospace, where he served as CEO for more than a decade. He later became President of Sentry International, an oilfield equipment manufacturing, distribution, and service company.

Mr. Pompeo graduated first in his class at the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1986 and served as a cavalry officer patrolling the Iron Curtain before the fall of the Berlin Wall. He also served with the 2<sup>nd</sup> Squadron, 7<sup>th</sup> Cavalry in the US Army's Fourth Infantry Division. After leaving active duty, Mr. Pompeo graduated from Harvard Law School, where he was an editor of the Harvard Law Review.

He is married to Susan Pompeo and has one son, Nick.

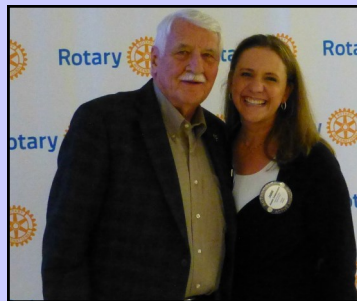
## ROTARY MEETING — OCTOBER 23
