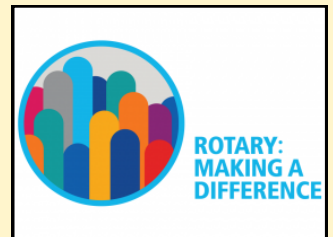

### January 22 — McConnell Air Force Base Update

Col. Bruce "Phil" Heseltine, Jr., is the Vice Commander, 22d Air Refueling Wing, McConnell AFB, KS. In this role, he assists the commander in providing all-weather, in-flight aerial refueling for United States and allied military aircraft, as well as Global Reach airlift for the rapid and precise projection of troops, equipment and supplies worldwide. Colonel Heseltine entered the Air Force in 1993 through the Reserve Officer Training Corps, University of Utah and has held multiple positions throughout his career in the U.S. Airforce. Colonel Heseltine has flown more than 70 combat and combat support sorties in Operations UNIFIED PROTECTOR, NORTHERN and SOUTHERN WATCH, NOBLE EAGLE, and both ENDURING and IRAQI FREEDOM. He is a command pilot with more than 2,400 hours in various KC-135R aircraft. His unique mission qualifications include Special Operations Air Refueling (SOAR) as well as being a member of the highly selective KC-135R/T (receiver) cadre.

Colonel Eric A. "Vito" Vitosh is the wing commander of the 931st Air Refueling Wing, McConnell Air Force Base, KS. The Wing reports to 4th Air Force, March Air Reserve Base, Calif., and is an Air Force Reserve KC-135 Stratotanker associate unit working alongside the 22nd Air Refueling Wing at McConnell AFB. In conjunction with the 22nd ARW, the 931st ARW supports Air Mobility command's worldwide air refueling mission, meeting the air refueling needs of all U.S. Air Force, Navy, Marine and selected allied nations' aircraft. In addition, they supplement AMC's strategic airlift capability. Furthermore, members of the 931st ARW are engaged in a cross section of combat support services for all U.S. military branches in times of peace, war and national emergency within the United States and abroad. Col. Vitosh entered the Air Force in 1987 through active duty enlistment and was commissioned in 1992 through the United States Air Force Academy.

Colonel David A. Weishaar is Commander, 184th Intelligence Wing, Kansas Air National Guard, McConnell Air Force Base, Kansas. He commands more than 1,200 Guardsmen who execute a broad spectrum of missions including intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance, network and information operations, and command and control all of which greatly enhances the U.S. Air Force's capability to provide actionable intelligence and information dominance for combat forces around the globe.

## Dr. Patrick Allen Bio (continued for previous page):

Patrick Allen, MD, received his undergraduate degree from Texas A&M University and his medical degree from the University of Texas at Houston. Dr. Allen then completed Family Medicine residency training and in 2014 a year-long International Family Medicine Fellowship at Via Christi.

Since September 2017, Dr. Allen has been serving as interim director for this unique fellowship, which was established 10 years ago to equip family physicians with the unique knowledge base and clinical skills needed to effectively care for patients living in some of the poorest and most under-resourced areas of the world.

Both during his fellowship and after, Dr. Allen has done rotations in Niger, caring for patients in a country that, based on a compilation of statistics by Save the Children, has been named the worst place in the world to be either a mother or a child.

Dr. Allen will share about his experiences overseas and how through the International Family Medicine Fellowship program he and the program's other fellows are making a difference worldwide.
