February 5 — Matt Perrier, Kansas Cattle Rancher

Topic: #RethinktheRanch

Matt Perrier of Eureka represents the fifth generation of his family's registered Angus and ranching operation. Dalebanks Angus started as a sheep farm in 1867. It has continuously maintained a registered Angus herd since 1904. Today, the seedstock cattle operation focuses on producing genetics for the commercial cow-calf producer.

The list of industry leadership positions he has held is lengthy. Perrier is a recent past president of the Kansas Livestock Association (KLA) and a past chairman of the KLA Stockgrowers Council. He has served on the KLA Executive Committee and KLA Board of Directors. He currently is on the National Cattlemen's Beef Association (NCBA) Board of Directors and is a member of the NCBA Ag and Food Policy Committee. Perrier attended the NCBA Young Cattlemen's Conference (YCC), serving as chairman of the group in 2007. Perrier also has attended the KLA Leadership Conference.

Perrier has served on the Kansas Animal Health Board. He is a past member of the US Premium Beef Nominating Committee and Kansas Angus Association Board of Directors. Perrier is a past president of both the Greenwood County Cattlemen's Association and Greenwood County Farm Bureau. He previously served as vice president of the Greenwood Preservation Society, which helped restore the historic Greenwood Hotel. He is an honorary member of the Greenwood County Cattlewomen by being an integral part in promoting agriculture through their annual Day at the Ranch event.

Perrier graduated from Kansas State University in 1996 with a degree in animal sciences & industry (AS&I). Prior to coming back to the family business, he was director of retail and foodservice programs for the Pennsylvania Beef Council and served in several staff capacities, including as a regional manager for the American Angus Association.

Matt and his wife, Amy, live with their four children on the Dalebanks ranch near Eureka.



February 12 — Raymond F. Geoffroy

Former Marine Corps Security Expert

Topic: Security Challenges in an Uncertain World

Raymond F. Geoffroy was a member of the Senior Executive Service; the former Assistant Deputy Commandant for Plans, Policies and Operations; and Director of the Security Division at Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps. He was responsible for providing direction, supervising development, articulating emerging concepts, and advocating Marine Corps capabilities for all issues pertaining to Anti-Terrorism and Force Protection, Marine Corps Security Forces, Marine Security Guards, Military Police, Homeland Defense, Mission Assurance, Physical Security and Law Enforcement, Counterdrug Support, Nonlethal Weapons, and Military Support to Civil Authorities for complex catastrophes.

Geoffroy served the Marine Corps for 44 years. For more than 20 years he served as an infantry officer in command and staff positions to include platoon commander, company commander, aircraft group logistics officer and assistant operations officer, battalion executive officer and regiment operations officer. As a senior executive, he was awarded the Meritorious Executive Presidential Rank Award and the Department of the Navy Distinguished Civilian Service Award. His education includes a BA in political science; a MS in education; and a MS in national security strategy from the National War College. He is a graduate of the FBI National Executive Institute.

Geoffroy retired from federal service in October, 2014. He serves on the Board of Directors of Homeland Security Solutions Incorporated and on the board of advisors for RedGuard/Cover Six, LLC. He resides in Wichita, KS.
