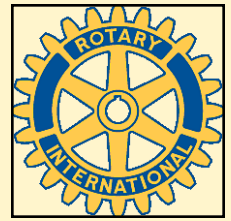

**March 5 — Michael Surbaugh**

**Chief Scout Executive of the Boy Scouts of America**

**Topic: *The Future of Ethical Leadership***

Michael Surbaugh is the thirteenth chief scout executive of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA), which is headquartered in Irving, Texas. After graduating from Salem College with a bachelor of arts degree in youth agency administration, he chose Scouting for his career.

In 1984, Surbaugh served as a district executive in Jacksonville, Florida, after which he held the positions of senior district executive and program director in Syracuse, New York. He served as field director, director of development and director of field service in Minneapolis, Minnesota and later as the Scout executive in South Dakota, Wisconsin and Pennsylvania. Surbaugh was promoted to BSA group director at the National Service Center in 2014 and held this position until being named chief scout executive in 2015.

Surbaugh is an Eagle Scout and an Order of the Arrow Vigil Honor member. He has completed Wood Badge. He is also proud to have served as camp director and as a member of summer camp staffs for 12 years. When he is not working to advance the BSA's mission, Mike and Lisa spend free time with hiking in the U.S. national parks and riding the couple's Harley-Davidson motorcycle.

Peter Zeihan is a geopolitical strategist and global energy demographic and security expert. His worldview marries the realities of geography and populations to a deep understanding of how global politics impact markets and economic trends. His irreverent approach transforms topics that are normally dense and heavy into accessible and relevant takeaways for audiences of all types. He is the author of *The Accidental Superpower: The Next Generation of American Preeminence and the Coming Global Disorder*, and *The Absent Superpower: The Shale Revolution and a World Without America*.

Zeihan's career has ranged from working for the US State Department in Australia and the DC think tank community, to helping develop the analytical models for Stratfor, a premier private intelligence company. He founded his own firm, Zeihan on Geopolitics in 2012, in order to specialize in customized executive briefings for his clients. Mr. Zeihan has been featured in, and cited by, numerous newspapers and broadcasts including *The Wall Street Journal*, *Forbes*, *AP*, *Bloomberg*, *CNN*, *ABC*, *The New York Times*, *Fox News* and *MarketWatch*.
