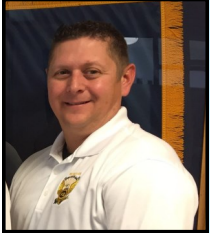

APRIL 2 — CARSON NUSS

KANSAS STATE HIGHWAY PATROL TECHNICAL TROOPER

TOPIC: *CHALLENGES FACING THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL EVALUATION UNIT OF THE KANSAS HIGHWAY PATROL*

Technical Trooper Carson A. Nuss is a 17-year member of the Kansas Highway Patrol with over 20 years in law enforcement. He has been assigned the last nine years to the Drug and Alcohol Evaluation Unit. The Unit is responsible for all the training in the State to recognize the people who are under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs. Understanding when someone is impaired is important, not just while they are driving. As the acceptance of drugs and their usage become more common, understanding how that can affect businesses with employment and customers is important. On Monday he will discuss the challenges, risks and plans to deal with these issues.

Douglas A. Girod began as the 18th chancellor of the University of Kansas in July 2017. A head-and-neck surgeon, Girod earned his bachelor's degree from the University of California at Davis and his medical degree from the University of California at San Francisco. He has been on the faculty at the University of Kansas since 1994 and has served in a variety of administrative roles, including executive vice chancellor, at KU Medical Center. Girod became executive vice chancellor of the University of Kansas Medical Center on Feb. 1, 2013. There he oversaw the educational, research, patient care and community engagement missions of the University of Kansas schools of Medicine, Nursing and Health Professions, with their total annual enrollment of more than 3,300 students; a workforce of more than 2,100 faculty and more than 4,000 staff; and research funding of nearly \$100 million.
