



MAY 7 — JONATHAN SANDYS

GREAT-GRANDSON OF WINSTON CHURCHILL AND AUTHOR

TOPIC: GOD AND CHURCHILL

GUEST RESERVATIONS REQUIRED

Jonathan Sandys is a great-grandson of Britain's wartime prime minister Sir Winston Churchill and an international public speaker on the life, times and leadership of his illustrious relative and the impact Sir Winston still has on the world today. He is the co-author of *God & Churchill*, which presents evidence strongly supporting Sir Winston's own view that his life was both guided and protected by, as he put it, "Divine intervention." Sandys is also the curator of the online publication *Impressions of Churchill*, which allows people who met the great man, as well as those who are just now old enough to have heard of him, to share their thoughts on the impact Sir Winston has made on their lives.

The legacy of Sir Winston Churchill and the Second World War is legendary, but most are unaware of the many struggles Churchill faced and overcame in every stage of life. Over his fifty-year political career, Churchill was ostracized by colleagues who called him a crank and he was rejected by many who he had once considered friends. With courage and faith, he stood for what he believed in. With integrity, he truly represented the people who had elected him. Churchill's courageous determination enabled the British to stand firm against Hitler and the Nazis, even when France surrendered and Britain stood alone. The example of Sir Winston Churchill is a legacy of success in the face of failure. It proudly stands as a demonstration of how one man's courageous determination, faithful leadership, and steadfast integrity in the face of defeat, changed the world.

MAY 14 — WAYNE BRYAN

PRODUCING DIRECTOR, MUSIC THEATRE WICHITA

TOPIC: MTWICHITA — A LEGACY OF DOWNTOWN INVOLVEMENT

WAYNE BRYAN is beginning his 31st season as Producing Artistic Director for Music Theatre Wichita...not bad for a fellow who had never been a producer when he showed up for duty here on April Fools' Day, 1988. He and his team are busily at work preparing for the 2018 summer season: *Sister Act*, *Guys and Dolls*, Disney's *Freaky Friday*, *Pippin*, and Disney's *The Little Mermaid*. In the course of his tenure here, Music Theatre has grown from a theatre with a budget of \$800,000 a year to the most highly subscribed non-profit arts organization in Kansas, with a budget of over \$4 million (at least 70% of which is annually spent back into the local economy). Combining education with professional theatrical production, Music Theatre Wichita has been internationally praised for its quality. It has also proven to be a significant economic booster for the city, the region, and the state. Unlike most musical theatres, all the shows seen at Century II during the summer months are created locally, using a unique mix of Broadway guest artists working hand in hand with talented young Midwesterners. Five Broadway-scale shows are built and presented within Century II during an intensely creative 10-week period, and Wayne and his team are constantly exploring new shows and new technologies, in addition to the classic titles and traditional approaches that have proven so successful.

Raised in southern California, Wayne performed on Broadway in *Good News!*, *Rodgers and Hart*, and *Tintypes*, and on television in such shows as "M*A*S*H" on CBS, "Keystone" on A&E, and "American History" on PBS. He has directed award-winning productions all across the country, from San Diego's Old Globe Theatre to New York's City Center, but feels he's doing his most challenging and rewarding work now. He is especially proud that so many young MTWichita alumni are currently performing on Broadway and all around the world. (About 40 are appearing on Broadway right now!)

SOCIAL EVENING FIRESIDE / NEW MEMBER RECEPTION MONDAY, MAY 21, 5:30 — 7:30 PM NEWMAN UNIVERSITY — BISHOP GERBER SCIENCE CENTER

This year we are excited to combine our new member reception with the final social Fireside of the Rotary year. Rotarians and guests are invited to gather in the foyer of Newman University's newest building, the Bishop Gerber Science Center, to enjoy cocktails and appetizers at 5:30 pm. At approximately 6:00 pm we will recognize the more than 50 new members who have joined the club in the past 12 months. A brief presentation will follow by Newman University President and Rotarian Noreen Carrocci and various science and nursing faculty. Guided tours will be available of the building's classrooms and labs including renovated spaces in the adjacent Eck Hall for Nursing and Allied Health programs.

The new, 51,400 square foot Bishop Gerber Science Center features interactive classrooms, labs, new equipment, collaborative learning spaces, and a functioning cadaver lab, which is being used to educate Newman students along with first-year KU Medical School-Wichita students. Also featured is an \$80,000 magnet used to examine carbon and hydrogen molecules in an atom, a DNA sequencer and spectrometers of all kinds along with many other tools likely not found on most college campuses. Upgrades to Eck Hall include a nursing lab with two intensive care simulation suites, a nursing anesthesia task training room with two operating room simulation suites, a nurse anesthesia task training room with two operating room simulation suites and a respiratory care classroom and lab.

Don't miss the opportunity to greet and congratulate our new members while enjoying a look at the largest project ever developed on the Newman campus.
