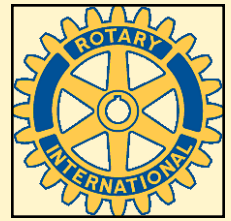

James Chung is president of Reach Advisors, a strategy, research and predictive analytics firm. Clients include some of the North America's most innovative organizations involved in community development, large-scale real estate development, tourism, cultural institutions and healthcare.

Prior to launching Reach Advisors, Chung founded a targeted media and research firm that he eventually sold to a Fortune 200 company. Before that, he worked at the nation's largest ad agency helping shepherd the planning around the future of media and consumer analytics for one of the world's largest brands.

Chung is a frequent keynote presenter at conferences for the industries he serves. He serves as a writer, analyst and recurring source for media organizations including *The New York Times*, *Wall Street Journal*, *TIME* and NPR. He also is the chairman of The Relevance Company, a Brooklyn-based cultural insights and strategy firm.

Chung earned his bachelors and MBA degrees from Harvard University. Before and after earning his MBA degree, he worked for multiple Knight-Ridder newspapers including the *Wichita Eagle*. Prior to that, his first job was working in the Wichita office of Senate Majority Leader Bob Dole.

**JUNE 18 — JIM REMAR**  
**KANSAS COSMOSPHERE PRESIDENT / CEO**  
**TOPIC: COSMOSPHERE'S SPACEWORKS DIVISION**

Jim Remar is a recognized expert in the areas of museum administration, strategic planning and space artifact preservation and exhibition. He began his career in 1997 as executive director of the Mifflinburg Buggy Museum in Mifflinburg, PA. He joined the Kansas Cosmosphere as curator in 2000, where he served eight years before joining Gregory, Inc as vice president of operations.

In 2012, Remar returned to the Cosmosphere as president and COO where he was responsible for all operations of the organization, including SpaceWorks. SpaceWorks is responsible for the restoration of artifacts as well as the fabrication of exhibitions and high fidelity replicas. He was named CEO of the organization in January 2018.

Remar has consulted with a variety of organizations including the White Sands Missile Range Museum, National Air and Space Museum and Fort Bliss Museum. He has also served as an editor and consultant for several print publications.

Jim received his bachelor's degree in history and political science from Washburn University. He earned a master's degree in museum studies with a minor in history from the University of Nebraska and a mini-MBA from Wichita State University.
