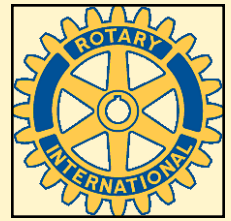

JUNE 18 — JIM REMAR

KANSAS COSMOSPHERE PRESIDENT / CEO

TOPIC: *COSMOSPHERE'S SPACEWORKS DIVISION*

Jim Remar is a recognized expert in the areas of museum administration, strategic planning and space artifact preservation and exhibition. He began his career in 1997 as executive director of the Mifflinburg Buggy Museum in Mifflinburg, PA. He joined the Kansas Cosmosphere as curator in 2000, where he served eight years before joining Gregory, Inc as vice president of operations.

In 2012, Remar returned to the Cosmosphere as president and COO where he was responsible for all operations of the organization, including SpaceWorks. SpaceWorks oversees the restoration of artifacts as well as the fabrication of exhibitions and high fidelity replicas. He was named CEO of the organization in January 2018.

Remar has consulted with a variety of organizations including the White Sands Missile Range Museum, National Air and Space Museum and Fort Bliss Museum. He has also served as an editor and consultant for several print publications.

Jim received his bachelor's degree in history and political science from Washburn University. He earned a master's degree in museum studies with a minor in history from the University of Nebraska and a mini-MBA from Wichita State University.

FOREIGN AID WORKER — SAMARITAN'S PURSE

TOPIC: *CHANGING PERSPECTIVES FROM HUMANITARIAN WORK IN THE FIELD*

Although most people work several different jobs in their lifetime, few will experience the dramatic changes in both career and life's direction as Nancy Smith. Nancy was born and raised in Topeka where she graduated from high school. She went on to graduate from Brown Mackie Business College and later earned a degree in operations management from Southwestern College in Winfield.

For 20 years Nancy worked at Cessna Aircraft, advancing through various positions in purchasing and supply chain management. Her life took a dramatic turn in June, 2010, when she began her career with Samaritan's Purse in response to the 7.0 earthquake which struck Haiti in January earlier that year. Samaritan's Purse is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to helping the world's poor, sick and suffering.

For the next three years Nancy worked and lived in Haiti. She later relocated to the Samaritan's Purse headquarters in Boone, North Carolina where she oversaw projects in Haiti, Bolivia and Honduras. She currently serves as a management facilitator supporting 15 field offices around the world in areas of procurement, operations and emergency medical programming. She does so remotely while living in Wichita when not deployed to the locations where services are being rendered.

Nancy will share some of her experiences over the past eight years as she has traveled the world serving in some of the most difficult situations from Haiti post-earthquake to Mosul, Iraq during the war against ISIS. She will also discuss her transition from corporate America to a humanitarian world, including the joys, difficulties and lessons learned.
