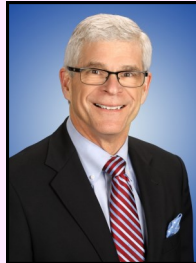


JULY 2 — ROTARY CLUB AND WRCF PASSING OF THE GAVEL

July 9 — RICHARD CROWSON, POLITICAL CARTOONIST

TOPIC: THIRTY YEARS OF EDITORIAL CARTOONING IN WICHITA

Richard Crowson was born in Memphis, TN, where he cartooned for his high school and college newspapers. After winning several national and regional awards, he became the first editorial cartoonist for *The Jackson Sun* in 1978. In 1986, Crowson joined the *Wichita Eagle* as the newspaper's first political cartoonist. Today his political cartoons appear in the Sunday edition of *The Eagle*.

Crowson's cartoons have been reprinted in *Time*, *Newsweek*, *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post* and *USA Today*. He was awarded first place for his Kansas political cartoons by the Kansas Press Association for 2017. He also draws web cartoons and records on-air commentaries for KMWU radio, Wichita's NPR affiliate. In 2015, Crowson won first place for editorial commentary from the Kansas Association of Broadcasters.

Crowson is a roster artist for Arts partners, producing classroom programs in cartooning and in bluegrass and folk music for Wichita schools. He and a friend perform as "Pete and Woody" for students, introducing them to the folk songs of Pete Seeger and Woody Guthrie.

Richard and his wife, Karen, are bluegrass musicians who have performed monthly at Watermark Books and Café for the last 18 years. The Crowsons reside in Wichita with their three Airedales.
