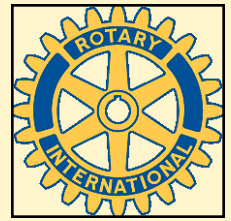

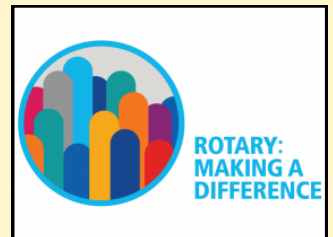

**APRIL 16 — ROGER MCCLELLAN — PRESIDENT — WILDCAT CONSTRUCTION**

**GARY JANZEN — ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS & CITY ENGINEERING**

**TOPIC: EAST AND WEST KELLOGG EXPANSION PROJECT**

Transportation construction projects are more than dirt movers and hard hats. It takes partnerships, communication and good design to make multi-million-dollar projects run smoothly and on time. On April 16, come hear Roger McClellan of Wildcat Construction, the general contractor for the East Kellogg construction projects from Webb to K-96, and Gary Janzen, city engineer, explain how improvements will not only keep traffic moving safely and efficiently in the eastern part of our city, but how transportation projects like these can improve economic development as well.



Roger McClellan is president of Wildcat Construction, overseeing the management and leadership of Wildcat and its affiliated entities. Prior to his role as president, he served as executive vice president of Wildcat and general counsel and director of human resources for the Sherwood Companies from 2006 through 2012. Roger is OSHA 30-hour trained, and he serves on the Wichita Chamber Transportation and Infrastructure subcommittee, the CEO Roundtable on Diversity and Inclusion, the Kansas 4-H Foundation Board of Trustees and is Past Chair of the K-State Alumni Association Board of Directors. Wildcat has become an industry leader in the Midwest, self-performing many types of civil construction including civil and structural concrete, earthwork and site prep, concrete and asphalt paving, rock excavation, piling and sheet piling, subgrade stabilization, and all underground utilities including sanitary sewer, water, storm sewer and main electrical distribution.



Gary Janzen is the assistant director of public works and city engineer for the City of Wichita. He joined the City in 1995 and became the city engineer in 2012. Prior to assuming his current position, he worked for 10 years in the construction division and seven years in design and project development. Janzen has a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from Kansas State University. During his years with the City, he has been directly involved with many infrastructure projects related to freeway, road, bridge, water, sewer, drainage and recreational improvements. A native of Newton, Kansas, Gary is active in numerous professional organizations including KSU Civil Engineering Advisory Council, the

board of directors for the Kansas Society of Professional Engineers and the Valley Center Planning Commission.

**APRIL 23 — BOB LUTZ, FORMER SPORTS WRITER AND FOUNDER OF LEAGUE 42**

**TOPIC: HITTING A HOMERUN FOR WICHITA YOUTH**



Bob Lutz is a native of Derby, Kansas and a graduate of Wichita State University. He went to work for the Wichita Eagle newspaper in 1974 where he worked until his retirement in 2017, including 20 years as a sports columnist. During his career, Lutz had a vision of founding an urban baseball league in the heart of Wichita, which would be accessible to youth whose economic situation prevented them from participating in the great sport of baseball. In 2013, aided by other supporters, League 42 was launched as a non-profit baseball league and it will celebrate its five-year anniversary this summer.

League 42 has grown from 16 teams and 200 youth in the first year to 42 teams and 575 youth in 2017. The City of Wichita has expanded the baseball facilities at the north end of McAdams Park which contributed to the growth. League 42 serves boys and girls, ages 5 through 14, and requires a \$30 participation fee per child or per family with more than one child.

Bob and the other supporters of League 42 believe this opportunity has struck a chord with Wichita and he hopes to combine his love of baseball and helping youth for many years to come.
