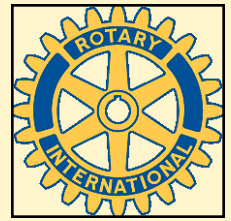

July 9 — RICHARD CROWSON, POLITICAL CARTOONIST

TOPIC: *THIRTY YEARS OF EDITORIAL CARTOONING IN WICHITA*

Richard Crowson was born in Memphis, TN, where he cartooned for his high school and college newspapers. After winning several national and regional awards, he became the first editorial cartoonist for *The Jackson Sun* in 1978. In 1986, Crowson joined the *Wichita Eagle* as the newspaper's first political cartoonist. Today his political cartoons appear in the Sunday edition of *The Eagle*.

Crowson's cartoons have been reprinted in *Time*, *Newsweek*, *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post* and *USA Today*. He was awarded first place for his Kansas political cartoons by the Kansas Press Association for 2017. He also draws web cartoons and records on-air commentaries for KMWJ radio, Wichita's NPR affiliate. In 2015, Crowson won first place for editorial commentary from the Kansas Association of Broadcasters.

Crowson is a roster artist for Arts partners, producing classroom programs in cartooning and in bluegrass and folk music for Wichita schools. He and a friend perform as "Pete and Woody" for students, introducing them to the folk songs of Pete Seeger and Woody Guthrie.

Richard and his wife, Karen, are bluegrass musicians who have performed monthly at Watermark Books and Café for the last 18 years. The Crowsons reside in Wichita with their three Airedales.

TOPIC: COMMUNITY RESPONSE TO LAW ENFORCEMENT

District Attorney Marc Bennett began his career in 1995 as an assistant county attorney in Gear County, Kansas. He later served as a deputy district attorney in the Sedgwick County District Attorney's office for 15 years during which he supervised the prosecution of sex crimes, human trafficking, domestic violence and elder abuse. He completed his undergraduate degree from Kansas State University and earned his juris doctor degree from Washburn University.

Bennett is a board member of numerous child advocacy organizations including the Sedgwick County Child Advocacy Center, the Kansas Attorney General's Human Trafficking Advisory Board and the Wichita Area Sexual Assault Center. He is the past president of the Kansas County and District Attorneys Association and an appointee to the Kansas Prosecutor's Grievance and Ethics Committee. He has addressed many groups including the Kansas legislature and the National Advocacy Center in South Carolina.

Marc and his wife, Tamara, reside in the western part of Sedgwick County with their three daughters. Marc and his extended family are regulars at the Walnut Valley Festival in Winfield each year.
