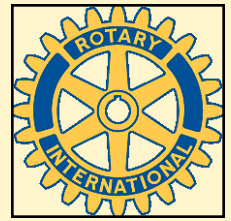

**TOPIC: COMMUNITY RESPONSE TO LAW ENFORCEMENT**

District Attorney Marc Bennett began his career in 1995 as an assistant county attorney in Geary County, Kansas. He later served as a deputy district attorney in the Sedgwick County District Attorney's office for 15 years during which he supervised the prosecution of sex crimes, human trafficking, domestic violence and elder abuse. He completed his undergraduate degree from Kansas State University and earned his juris doctor degree from Washburn University.

Bennett is a board member of numerous child advocacy organizations including the Sedgwick County Child Advocacy Center, the Kansas Attorney General's Human Trafficking Advisory Board and the Wichita Area Sexual Assault Center. He is the past president of the Kansas County and District Attorneys Association and an appointee to the Kansas Prosecutors' Grievance and Ethics Committee. He has addressed many groups including the Kansas legislature and the National Advocacy Center in South Carolina.

Marc and his wife, Tamara, reside in the western part of Sedgwick County with their three daughters. Marc and his extended family are regulars at the Walnut Valley Festival in Winfield each year.
