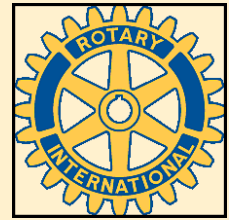

ABOUT THE CANDIDATES

July 22, 2019

Amy Lyon– Amy has worked twenty-two years in leadership at Wolters Kluwer Tax Compliance business unit. She served as Senior Manager and created an overseas team to support customers across sixteen countries. Amy managed a multi-million dollar budget and was responsible for client collaboration, software creation and implementation on a global platform. Amy is a US Navy Veteran who currently serves as the Kansas Director of Objective Zero, an online platform working to end suicide among the service member and veteran population. She is running for mayor because she believes in service to her country and community. Amy has volunteered for Habitat for Humanity, Women’s Crisis Center, Inter-Faith Ministries and served on the Board of YMCA Camp and Childcare.

Joshua Atkinson– Joshua is an HVAC mechanic, husband and father of three. Following his father’s military career at Ft. Riley, his family relocated to Wichita in 1994. Like many Americans, Josh did not complete college and joined the workforce immediately after high school. He is currently a Master HVAC Journeyman. Josh says he wants to lend every ounce of opportunity for governing Wichita to the people by clarifying difficult wording and legislation, implementing a new, distinguishable education system for the City of Wichita. He believes we should put hate-filled newsfeed behind us, put politics and indifference in the past, focus on “together,” and on kids; the promise of the future. To people of Wichita, Josh wants to say he believes in Wichita as a city of the future sooner than later.

Marty Mork– Marty has been married for 33 years, has five kids and 17 grandchildren. Marty worked for Kansas State Grain Inspection for 13 years, then worked for Boeing. In 2004 Marty became disabled with RA. If elected, Marty will focus on bringing the hemp industry jobs to Wichita, jobs associated with grains, such as bakeries and will decriminalize marijuana. Marty is pro-life and supports the Second Amendment. He believes tax dollars should only go to American workers.

Lyndy Wells– Lyndy grew up in Newton and attended school there. He has served as president of two Bank IV community banks before moving to Wichita and calling it home for the last 20 years. For 17 of those years he has been with INTRUST Bank in the Public Affairs Division. His entire professional career has been devoted to service in the community. Lyndy has served as WSU Tech Board of Directors Chair; Ascension Via Christie Chair; Greater Wichita Economic Development Chair; Prairie View Chair, Wichita Regional Chamber of Commerce Chair; United Way Campaign Cabinet; Greater Wichita Partnership, Business and Education Alliance and St. Stephens Episcopal Church, Treasurer. Lyndy’s wife, Marty, also serves on several boards and is a volunteer with CASA. They have three grown children and five grandchildren.

Brock Booker – Brock hails from Parsons, Ks, where he became well-known at a young age for his talent as a singer and performer. Brock has worked, tirelessly, throughout his life as a volunteer to serve the quality of life and unity for all citizens, building on the legacy of his grandfather, the late Robert Booker, Sr. Brock has a history of “firsts” in his family and hopes to continue that legacy. He is a member of the Singing Quakers, Friends University, sings with the Wichita Symphony Orchestra and is a member of ARISE (African Americans Renewing Interest in Spirituals). Booker serves on many community action boards and believes in creative problem solving that includes a broad array of opinions, viewpoints and needs.
